Notre Dame's traditional Golden Mass was celebrated on Friday, December 20, 2024, in the Charles & Mary Crossed Auditorium. We welcomed alumni and friends to celebrate with current students and families. **Fr. Scott Kubinski '84** joined us as celebrant of the Mass.

Golden Mass is a beloved tradition at ND; for many alumni, it is one of their favorite memories of Notre Dame. When the curtains are pulled back to display the many gifts and food items collected by students and their families, the reaction of those gathered in the auditorium is one of wonder, excitement and joy. As alumni joined the choir at the front of the auditorium for a chorus (or two) of "Joy to the World", the spirit of Christmas was everywhere you looked.

Notre Dame sponsored 21 families and 64 children in our community. Following the Mass, as excited students were dismissed for Christmas break, they were reminded of the real meaning of Christmas. They cleared the stage and packed their cars, and left the school to distribute the food and gifts.

THE CHRISTMAS SUIT

With great appreciation for her contributions to Notre Dame High School, we are sad to share the news that Sister Dolores Ann Stein, RSM passed away on February 2, 2025. She earned her Bachelor of Science degree at Marywood College, her Master of Science degree from SUNY Albany, and her Permanent Certifications in Business Education and Administration and Supervision from SUNY Albany.

Sister Dolores Ann taught several diocesan schools before joining Notre Dame High School in 1969, where she taught until 1984. She served as principal at St. Ann's School in Hornell, NY from 1984–2007. Sister then served as an administrative assistant to the superintendents of the diocesan department of Catholic schools as well as an administrative assistant at Nazareth Elementary School. She was also co-director of Mercy Bridges, a literacy ministry sponsored by the Sisters of Mercy.

While at ND, Sister touched hundreds of students' lives and she remained a strong supporter of Notre Dame, attending many events in recent years. When approached by alumni, Sister Dolores Ann always remembered their name, and more often than not, some of their exploits while they were her students. The Notre Dame community shares in her family's loss and sends sympathies to them and the Sisters of Mercy.


Alumni News





ND Alumni inducted into Chemung County Hall of Fame

Natalie Frost '04 and **Olivia May '13**, two of the most accomplished athletes in Elmira Notre Dame history, were among the 2024 inductees in the Chemung County Sports Hall of Fame. Longtime area coach and broadcaster, **Larry Ransey '70**, was also inducted. The induction ceremony was held on the opening day of the annual Josh Palmer Christmas Class Basketball Tournament.

Natalie Frost '04 played five seasons of varsity soccer and four seasons of basketball. She helped the Crusaders to a combined eight sectional finals and six appearances in the state tournament. Natalie was Notre Dame's Female Athlete of the Year as a senior. She still holds Notre Dame records for goals (139) and points (338) in soccer and she had 60 career assists. Natalie was a first-team all-state pick as a senior in 2003, when she helped Notre Dame to the Class C state title. She was a third-team all-state choice in 2001 and 2002. Natalie was also part of five sectional championships in softball and was a four-time all-state selection. She helped Niagara University's women's soccer team to two Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference championship games and the program's first MAAC title in 2006. She was chosen to the MAAC all-rookie team as a freshman

Olivia May '13 was a two-time Class C Player of the Year in softball and was named first-team all-state four times. She pitched Notre Dame to a 26-0 record and a Class C state championship in 2011. Olivia tossed 17 shutouts and had a 0.33 ERA that season. She set 10 state pitching records and her overall record was 90-11, including 46 shutouts, 12 no-hitters and 1,138 strikeouts. At the plate, she hit 26 career home runs and drove in 178 runs. In addition, Olivia was a two-time all-state pick in basketball and a tennis standout. She played softball at Cornell University. Olivia was inducted into the New York State Softball Hall of Fame in 2023 and was inducted into the Section 4 Hall of Fame in 2024.

Alumni **Larry Ransey '70** was also inducted in recognition of his coaching and broadcasting career. Larry started coaching in 1976, leading a CYO team at St. Peter and Paul. He coached Elmira Small Fry in the 1970s and 1980s, then was assistant boys basketball coach at Elmira Free Academy from 1991 to 1997. Larry began broadcasting games in the 1980s for WELM radio and has worked as a color commentator alongside Bob Michaels on RLM Sports. He called games on WETM-TV from 2007 to 2010.




