MIDDLE STATES ACCREDITATION

On October 21, 2024, NDHS welcomed the visiting team from the Middle States Association to our school. The team was led by Michelle Haag Ph.D and consisted of volunteers Katherine Spillman, principal of Mount St. Mary Academy in Buffalo, and Pat Monachino, principal of St. James School in Johnson City, Diocese of Syracuse.

The Middle States Association of Schools and Colleges has accredited Notre Dame since 1961. Since that first visit, the school has maintained its Middle States accreditation through periodic self-studies and goal setting. Accreditation benefits our school by verifying that the school meets high standards, helping with recruitment, being part of issuing immigration documents for international students, and facilitating strategic planning and self-assessment.

The individuals that make up the Notre Dame family collaborated for 18 months before the visit to gather and evaluate evidence that the school meets the Middle States standards. After reading these 2024 self-study documents, the team talked to dozens of stakeholders including students, faculty, Board members, parents, and teachers who are parents, and volunteers who are grandparents. They reported that they "saw a community that has formed a family." You all collaborate, share experiences and look out for each other, just like a family." They observed that many individuals wore multiple hats and joyfully engaged in creating the sense of family that is a hallmark of our school. They noted ND's expansion of its mission to welcome students of all backgrounds and faiths. In meeting with our students and spending time in classrooms and other spaces, they saw traditional, non-catholic, and international students all learning from each other and contributing to the vibrant expression of the school's mission. The team recognized academic excellence, faculty expertise, and the strong leadership of the administrative team. They were pleased to hear students comment on our caring faculty and their accessibility. Sister Mary Walter told the team ND's story and shared the connections to the Sisters of Mercy.

From the self study, the Notre Dame Planning Committee selected goals to benefit our students with a complete and aligned curriculum, a revised class schedule, and an organizational objective to create a farreaching plan for financial stability and enrollment growth. The Middle States Visiting Team helped us polish our goals and action plan.

In their oral summary report, the team announced: "To all of the stakeholders in the Notre Dame High School family, our team will recommend accreditation with no stipulations to the Middle States Commission." The final accreditation will be awarded when the Middle States Commission meets in the spring. Notre Dame was thrilled to hear this recommendation. The team left us with encouragement to celebrate, proclaim, and reach out to others about the uniqueness of Notre Dame!

We thank the visiting team and all of the Notre Dame family who helped to make this accreditation visit a success.

ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME

The Notre Dame Athletic Hall of Fame inductions were held prior to ND's Homecoming game on October 4, 2024. The Athletic Hall of Fame Class of 2024 includes **Matthew Buice '09, Bernadette (Gublo '12) Brown, Sheridan Heine '14,** and **Jonas McCaig '14.** Congratulations to the newest Hall of Fame members!

Matthew Buice '09 is the first member of the Class of 2009 to be inducted into the Hall of Fame. Matt earned a total of 7 varsity letters while playing football and competing on the indoor track teams. In football, as a senior, he rushed for 728 yards with 11 touchdowns. In the 2008 state semifinal game, Matt led the Crusaders with 17 tackles and 47 rushing yards. That same season, Matt was named to the 1st team All-Twin Tiers team and was the Star-Gazette Defensive Player of the Year. In 2008, he was a 1st team All-State selection as a linebacker and was awarded with the Ernie Davis Award, given to the area's best football player. Matt graduated from University of Florida with a BS in Marine Biology and Biological Oceanography. He is the cofounder of Wild Florida Rescue Corp., a non-profit ambulance service for sick, injured, and orphaned wildlife. He has worked as a Veterinary Technician and as a member of the Gulf Corps Student Conservation Association's Texas crew, where he was involved with helping state and federal partners restore natural lands along the coast. Currently, Matt is the Fire and Fuels Crew Lead in Uwharrie National Forest in Central North Carolina. He lives in North Carolina with his wife, **Danielle Huffner '09.** Matt's award was accepted on his behalf by Danielle's aunt, Susan (Boedicker '80) Post, and grandmother, Dolores (Salafia '54) Boedicker.

Bernadette (Gublo '12) Brown was a three-sport star for the Crusaders. As a player, she led the soccer, basketball and softball teams and was Captain of both the soccer and the basketball squads. She helped lead the 2011 girls soccer team to a sectional title and was named 1st team All-IAC and 1st team All-State that season. In basketball, Detta played on the 2012 sectional championship team and was 1st Team All IAC and 1st team All-State. As a Lady Crusader, she played shortstop on the IAC Championship softball team and was named 2nd team All-IAC. Detta was named the Notre Dame 2011 Female Athlete of the Year in addition to earning the title of Elmira Star Gazette 2011 Female Athlete of the Year and Kiwanis Athlete of the year. As a Notre Dame student athlete, she was a member of the National Honor Society. Following graduation, Detta went on to Corning Community College where she played soccer and received an Associates of Science degree. She completed her undergraduate degree at University of North Carolina with a BA in Biology, and her Doctor of Pharmacy Degree at UNC's Eshelman School of Pharmacy. Detta completed her two year residency training at the Providence Veteran Affairs Medical Center in New Hampshire where she currently works as a Clinical Pharmacist Practitioner in Primary Care. Detta and her husband, **Brian Brown '12**, live in Cranston, Rhode Island.

Sheridan Heine '14 earned 7 varsity letters at Notre Dame, playing both soccer and basketball for the Crusaders. As goalkeeper for the soccer team, she was 2nd team All-State and was named All-Region Goalkeeper

of the Year in 2013. In basketball, Sheridan led Notre Dame to the 2012 Section IV Championship and a berth in the quarterfinals of the state tournament. In 2013, she averaged 13 points per game, receiving 2nd team All-Conference and All-Region honors and was named 5th team All-State. In 2014, she averaged 18.9 points per game, earning her the IAC MVP for basketball and 2nd team All-State. Sheridan scored over 1,000 points in her basketball career at Notre Dame and was named the 2014 Co-Athlete of the Year. She went on to Division 1 Manhattan College where she played college basketball and earned her BA in Communications. Sheridan currently lives and works in Texas, while pursuing a Project Management certification from Louisiana State University's online program.

Jonas McCaig '14 earned 6 Varsity letters as an athlete at Notre Dame. He was a 1st team All-IAC basketball selection, as well as a 1st team Section 4 lacrosse selection in both 2013 and 2014. In 2014, Jonas was the Section IV leader in scoring with 63 goals and 40 assists in lacrosse. Jonas remains the all-time leading scorer in the Notre Dame Lacrosse program and was named Notre Dame's 2014 Lacrosse team MVP, along with Male Scholar Athlete of the Year. In basketball, Jonas averaged 10.4 points per game, helping to lead his team to a sectional title in 2014. Jonas continued his lacrosse career at Franciscan University of Steubenville, where he remains the program's leader in goals. He earned both his bachelor's degree in Accounting and his MBA while at Franciscan. Working at AuditBoard, a cloud-based audit & risk management platform, Jonas is engaged to Katie McCallon and lives in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania




